Conduct of Annual Examinations - March, 2021

The following guidelines are being formulated after duly incorporating some of the suggestions made by the Heads of the Institutions through online Meeting with regard to conduct of Annual Examinations for the all the AEC Schools/JCs for the Academic Session 2020-21.

1. Examination Dates: A separate sheet of the Schedule of Annual Examinations for the Academic Session 2020-21 is attached. **There is no Examination for Classes I and II.**
2. Syllabus:
 - a. Classes III to VIII-Only Term II syllabus is prescribed.
 - b. Classes IX & XI- as per the CBSE Guidelines.
3. Declaration of the Result: The results are to be declared on 30.03.2021.
4. Reopening of the Schools: 01.04.2021.
5. Mode of Examination: There are 3 modes of examination being suggested. The schools can follow any two or three modes based on the local needs and available resources and in consultation with the Chairman LMC of the school concerned and as per the direction of Local Government Authority. Parents of each student will submit their option for mode of examination at least one week before the date of first examination.
 - a. **Online Examination:** In this mode, the question paper will be sent to the students online as per the schedule and the students submit their answer sheets online with a certificate from the parent mentioning the beginning and ending time of the Child's answering the Question paper.
 - b. **Offline Examination:** In this mode, the students will come to the schools as per the schedule of the Examination and write the examination sitting in the classroom, strictly adhering to the SOPs of the Local DAE Unit and as per the direction of Local Government Authority. The students can opt for this mode of examinations with the written consent of the parent.
 - c. **Drop Box System:** In this mode, the parents will be informed a specific time to come to school to pick up the question paper. The student after writing the examination at home, the answer paper will be dropped by the parents on the same day of the examination in the drop box provided at the school

with a certificate of the parent mentioning the beginning and ending time of the Child's answering the Question paper.

d. **For classes IX and XI , it shall be as per CBSE norms**

6. Question Paper:

a. **TWO sets of separate question papers of equal difficulty will be prepared for all the subjects of the classes III to VIII and IX by the Academic Unit and the same will be sent to all the schools – one set will be for online examinations, and another set for Offline Examinations and Drop Box mode of examination.**

b. Classes III to V: The Annual Examination is for 40 marks for each subject. It has the following components

i. Oral- 10 marks and duration of the time for oral test is 10 minutes per subject for each student. The teacher concerned will ask the student two questions and accordingly marks are to be recorded. This test will be done in virtual mode. The students for whom the oral test cannot be conducted virtually due to lack of network or any technical reason, additional questions will be provided in the question paper meant for written examination.

➤ Some more instructions for conducting the oral test will be intimated to the schools, soon.

ii. Written Question paper is for 30 marks

a. MCQs- 10 marks

b. Descriptive questions- 20 marks

➤ The duration of written examination including the reading time is 1 hr 30 minutes.

➤ The blue print of the question paper will be circulated to the schools, soon.

➤ Additional time may be given for uploading the answer sheets by the students.

c. Classes VI to VIII: The session ending exam is for 80 marks for each subject. It has the following components.

i. Oral- 10 marks and duration of the time for oral test is 10 minutes per subject for each student. The teacher concerned will ask the student

two questions and accordingly marks are to be recorded. This test will be done in virtual mode. The students for whom the oral test cannot be conducted virtually due to lack of network or any technical reason, additional questions will be provided in the question paper meant for written examination.

- Some more instructions for conducting the oral test will be intimated to the schools, soon.

ii. Written Question paper is for 70 marks with the following split-up

a. MCQs-25 marks

b. Descriptive Questions- 45 marks

- The duration of examination including the reading time is 2hr 15 minutes.

- The blue print of the question paper will be circulated to the schools, soon.

- Additional time may be given for uploading the answer sheets by the students.

- Schools can plan the conduct of examinations in additional subjects accordingly.

d. Class IX: Question Paper and blue print are as per CBSE norms.

e. Class XI: The question papers have to be set up by the respective schools/junior Colleges as per the norms of the Board to which they are affiliated to.

7. Weightage of Marks in Term 1 & 2:

a. Classes III to VIII: 20% weightage has to be given for internal assessment including periodic tests and all other components of internal assessment. The remaining 80% weightage has to be given to Term Ending Examinations. It will work out 10% of internal assessment and 40% of term ending examination for each term.

b. Class IX& XI: As per the CBSE/State Board norms.

8. Passing Criteria: The existing norms prescribed for all the classes.

9. Academic Prizes and Ranks:

a. In no case ranks /star marks shall be given to the students for classes I to IX and XI.

b. Academic prizes shall only be given to the toppers in the Examinations conducted by the CBSE or State Boards of Examinations.

10. **All these instructions are applicable only for the academic year 2020- 2021.**
